<u>Timeline of Senator Manchin's Efforts to Protect Cleveland-Cliffs, United Steelworkers,</u> and the Domestic Steel Industry against Illegally Dumped and Subsidized Imports:

On April 4, 2024, Senator Manchin participated in a roundtable discussion with Weirton leadership to discuss the recent job losses from the closure of the Cleveland-Cliffs tin mill facility and the region's economic development opportunities going forward.

On March 5, 2024, Senator Manchin called on President Biden to reverse course and oppose three proposed Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) rules that would devastate the U.S. domestic steel industry and threaten American jobs.

On February 15, 2024, Senator Manchin released a statement after the Cleveland-Cliffs tin mill steel facility announced its closure, which will result in nearly 1,000 employee layoffs in April.

On February 6, 2024, Senator Manchin released a statement on the ITC's determination that imports of tin mill products from China, Canada and Germany do not sufficiently harm the domestic steel industry.

On January 8, 2024, Senator Manchin applauded the Commerce Department for its announcement that imports of tin mill products from China, Germany and South Korea were being unfairly priced or dumped into the U.S. market, and that imports of tin mill products from China were also being subsidized.

On January 4, 2024, Senator Manchin testified before the ITC in support of Cleveland-Cliffs and United Steelworkers' anti-dumping (AD) and countervailing duty (CVD) petitions on imported tin mill products.

On September 26, 2023, Senator Manchin toured the Cleveland-Cliffs tin mill facility in Weirton with Senator Sherrod Brown (D-OH). The Senators also spoke with steelworkers and met with Cleveland-Cliffs' Chairman, President & CEO, Lourenco Goncalves to discuss the impacts of a recent tin mill products trade case involving imports from eight countries.

On May 12, 2023, Senator Manchin reinforced his support for the domestic steel industry in West Virginia after Cleveland-Cliffs announced the lay-off of 300 employees at their Weirton tin mill operation due to dumped and subsidized imports.

On February 2, 2023, Senator Manchin expressed support for the antidumping and countervailing duty petitions filed by Cleveland-Cliffs and the United Steelworkers.
