Additionally, through CDC support, their residents and frontline organizations have access to COVID-19 prevention education materials, COVID-19 vaccines and knowledge, and resources to improve organizational stability and sustainability to react to the COVID-19 pandemic's effect. Rural and geographically disconnected clients and groups are having trouble accessing and delivering critical health services as a result of social distancing and service shutdowns in West Virginia.

This unique funding opportunity will allow CEG to expand its reach into West Virginia's rural, disadvantaged, indigent, and minority communities, as well as the rest of Appalachia and the nation. It would also allow them to bring a number of jobs at various levels to a state in desperate need.
