A BILL

To require certain practitioners authorized to prescribe controlled substances to complete continuing education.

1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-

2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,

3 SECTION 1. SHORT TITLE.

4 This Act may be cited as the "Safer Prescribing of5 Controlled Substances Act".

6 SEC. 2. CONTINUING EDUCATION REQUIREMENTS FOR
7 CERTAIN PRACTITIONERS PRESCRIBING
8 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES.

9 Section 303 of the Controlled Substances Act (21
10 U.S.C. 823) is amended—

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(1) in subsection (f), in the matter preceding
 paragraph (1), by striking "The Attorney General
 shall register" and inserting "Subject to subsection
 (k), the Attorney General shall register";

5 (2) by redesignating subsection (k) as sub6 section (l); and

7 (3) by inserting after subsection (j) the fol-8 lowing:

9 "(k)(1) In this subsection, the term 'covered practi10 tioner' means a practitioner that is not a hospital, phar11 macy, or veterinarian.

12 "(2) As a condition of granting or renewing the reg-13 istration of a covered practitioner under this part to dispense, or conduct research with, controlled substances in 14 15 schedule II, III, IV, or V, the Attorney General shall re-16 quire the covered practitioner to complete training 17 through accredited continuing prescriber education that 18 the Secretary of Health and Human Services determines meets the requirements under paragraph (3), unless the 19 20 covered practitioner meets the conditions described in 21 paragraph (6).

"(3) The training provided for purposes of paragraph
(2) shall, at a minimum, expose covered practitioners to—
"(A) best practices for pain management, including responsible prescribing of pain medications,

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alternatives to prescribing controlled substances and
 other alternative therapies to decrease the use of
 opioids;

4 "(B) tools to manage adherence and diversion
5 of controlled substances, including prescription drug
6 monitoring programs, drug screening, informed con7 sent, overdose education, and the use of opioid over8 dose antagonists; and

9 "(C) best practices for substance use disorder 10 treatment, including methods for diagnosing, treat-11 ing, and managing a substance use disorder, includ-12 ing the use of medications approved by the Food 13 and Drug Administration and evidence-based non-14 pharmacological therapies, and linking patients to 15 evidence-based treatment for substance use dis-16 orders.

17 "(4) The Substance Abuse and Mental Health Serv18 ices Administration shall establish or support the estab19 lishment of not less than 1 training module that meets
20 the requirements under paragraph (3) that is provided—

"(A) to any covered practitioner registered or
applying for a registration under this part to dispense, or conduct research with, controlled substances in schedule II, III, IV, or V;

1 "(C) free of charge.

2 "(5) The Secretary of Health and Human Services
3 shall establish, maintain, and periodically update a pub4 lically available database providing information relating to
5 training modules that meet the requirements under para6 graph (3).

7 "(6) A covered practitioner shall be deemed as com8 pleting the training described in paragraph (2) if the cov9 ered practitioner completes accredited continuing pre10 scriber education, that—

11 "(A) is required, as a condition of State prac-12 tice licensure, to fulfill mandated training or edu-13 cation related to best practices in pain management 14 and substance use disorder treatment, that is sub-15 stantially similar to the requirements described in 16 paragraph (3); or

17 "(B) is required, as a condition of maintaining 18 a board certification recognized by the appropriate 19 board certification organizations for the covered pre-20 scriber to fulfill mandated training or education re-21 lated to best practices in pain management and sub-22 stance use disorder treatment, that is substantially 23 similar to the requirement described in paragraph 24 (3).

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"(7) Not later than 5 years after the date of enact ment of the Safer Prescribing of Controlled Substances
 Act, the Secretary of Health and Human Services shall
 evaluate, and make publically available a report describ ing, how exposure to the training required under this sub section has changed prescribing patterns of controlled sub stances.".
